Dear Mrs. Young,

I am writing this letter to strongly urge the Escambia Board of County Commissioners to consider and approve the 3% pay increase for the Escambia County Sheriff's Office employees, as requested in our FY 09/10 budget amount of \$76,190,100. Even with the cost of the 3% increase the sheriff's office would still realize a reduction from FY 08/09 budget of approximately \$2.5 million. This would be a 3.2% decrease over last year's budget. This decrease would be in line with what our peer counties are proposing for their FY 09/10 budgets (see chart below).

I believe it is also important to look at the circumstances within our county that our employees are dealing with as compared to our peer counties. Several weeks ago we provided you with a comparison of the Escambia County Sheriff's Office against eight other sheriff's offices and one police department. In the comparison it is evident that our employees are working with some of the highest crime, highest inmate populations, and a higher percentage of violent crimes (based on state incarceration rate). Considering this we also compared the starting

salary for deputies and found that the Escambia County Sheriff's Office has one of the lowest among our peer counties (see chart below). Also shown in the comparison is our ratio of deputies per citizens, we fall well below the state average and below most of the comparison counties. To summarize, our employees are working with some of the highest, more violent crimes and earning some of the lowest salaries.

When you examine past pay increases you will note that our employees only received a 1% increase in FY 07/08 and did not receive an increase in FY 08/09. If they do not receive an increase next fiscal year (09/10), that will mean that in a three year span our employees will only have received an increase of 1%. Again I urge you to approve the 3% increase and accept the \$2.5 million budget reduction proposed for FY 09/10. Thank you for your consideration.
