

PUBLIC NOTICE TO BIDDERS

SOLICITATION OF SEALED BIDS

FOR LIGHTING REPLACEMENT AT PUBLIC BUILDINGS

TOWN OF CENTURY

Sealed bids will be received by the Town of Century at Century Town Hall, located at 7995 North Century Boulevard, Century, Florida, until **Thursday, June 2, 2011, at 9:00 a.m. local time** at which time bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. Bids will be for replacement of the existing lighting at three (3) municipal-owned buildings located within the Town of Century, through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (AARA), in conjunction with a Florida Energy and Climate Commission, Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG). All contracts in excess of \$2,000 for construction or repair shall comply with the Davis-Bacon Act, the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act and the Buy American Act.

For bids to be considered, all bids must include all itemized costs, total bid cost, must be in ink, and must be signed by the submitting contractor. Any bid that does not meet the above requirements will not be considered.

A **MANDATORY** pre-bid construction conference will be held on Thursday, May 19, 2011, at 10:00 a.m. at Century Town Hall. **Only those contractors attending the pre-bid construction conference will be allowed to bid on this project.** All bids must be marked on the outside of the sealed envelope, "Century Lighting Replacement Project." If bids are not properly marked, they will not be opened and will be disqualified.

The Town of Century reserves the right to waive irregularities in bids, to reject any or all bids with or without cause and to award the bid it determines to be in the best interest of the Town of Century.
